AJWS grantees pushed for and passed laws and policies that protect human rights locally, regionally and nationally.

ENVIRONMENTAL WIN, EI Salvador


Local Salvadoran farmers won a landmark case making their country the first ever to ban gold mining, which was poisoning El Salvador's land, water and people.

WOMEN'S EQUALITY, India

Indian activists overturned triple talaq, which had authorized Muslim men to divorce their wives by merely saying or writing the word divorce three times.

EQUITABLE ELECTIONS, Senegal

In 2010, AJWS grantee Conseil Sénégalais des Femmes helped pass a law dictating that half of all political candidates must be women. When some cities didn't enforce it, Association des Juristes Sénégalaises sued—and has won cases across the country to ensure that women are on the ballot.
